VIRTUE AND APPLIED ETHICS

Virtue ethics is increasingly being touted as a viable alternative to consequentialism and deontology in applied ethics. This is partly the result of developments in philosophy and partly due to greater involvement/participation of practitioners in applied ethical issues. The aim of this workshop is to bring together these two perspectives. The first part of the workshop will involve looking at virtue theory generally and the prospects for its application. The second part will focus on arguably the leading recent work on this issue – *Virtue Ethics and Professional Roles* by Justin Oakley and Dean Cocking.
