ABOUT THE UNIT

<p>GES3260/GYM4260 WILL BE TAUGHT ON LOCATION IN THE WONDERFUL PARCO NAZIONALE DELLE CINQUE TERRE ON THE ITALIAN RIVIERA. IN ITS WORLD HERITAGE LISTING OF THE AREA UNESCO CITES THE “CULTURAL LANDSCAPE OF HIGH CULTURAL AND SCENIC VALUE ... THE FORM AND DISPOSITION OF SMALL TOWNS ... THE SHAPING OF THE LANDSCAPE (AND) ENCAPSULATION OF THE CONTINUOUS HISTORY OF SETTLEMENT OVER THE PAST MILLENNIUM.” ALTHOUGH IDENTIFIED AS A REGIONAL ENVIRONMENT AND CULTURAL LANDSCAPE WORTH PRESERVING FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS, THE CINQUE TERRE IS UNDER HUGE ENVIRONMENTAL PRESSURE AS A RESULT OF 20TH CENTURY RURAL DEPOPULATION, ABANDONMENT OF AGRICULTURAL LANDS, LANDSCAPE INSTABILITY, AND BURGEONING TOURISM. THIS UNIT WILL PROVIDE STUDENTS AT BOTH LEVELS 3 AND 4 WITH UNIQUE INSIGHT, IN A FIELD-BASED CONTEXT, INTO THE INTEGRATED REGIONAL GEOGRAPHY, CULTURAL LANDSCAPE AND SUSTAINABILITY OF THIS SMALL REGION. PROBLEMS OF INTEGRATING TOURISM AND AGRICULTURAL OBJECTIVES WHILE MINIMISING NEGATIVE ENVIRONMENTAL AND CULTURAL IMPACTS WILL BE EXPLORED, AND POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS FOR REGIONAL SUSTAINABILITY PROPOSED. THIS UNIT IS BEING ACTIVELY SUPPORTED BY THE NATIONAL PARK AND THERE WILL BE UNIQUE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS TO INTERACT WITH PARK MANAGEMENT AND STAFF.</p>	
TEACHING LOCATION	<p>THE UNIT IS BASED IN THE SMALL VILLAGE OF RIOMAGGIORE IN THE CINQUE TERRE, LIGURIA, ITALY. CLASSES WILL BE HELD IN THE CASTELLO (CASTLE) DI RIOMAGGIORE, AT THE COASTAL WILDLIFE SANCTUARY OF TORRE GUARDIOLA, AND IN THE FIELD.</p>
TIMETABLE	<p>THE UNIT WILL OPERATE OVER A 10 DAY PERIOD DURING THE FIRST HALF OF DECEMBER, 2007. THERE WILL BE A 2-3 HOUR PRE-TRIP MEETING AT MONASH DURING SEMESTER 2, 2007. ASSESSABLE WORK WILL BE COMPLETED IN THE FIELD AND BY THE FIRST WEEK OF SEMESTER 1, 2008.</p>
TRAVEL	<p>STUDENTS WILL MAKE THEIR OWN WAY FROM MELBOURNE TO THE CINQUE TERRE. THE CINQUE TERRE IS BEST ACCESSED BY TRAIN EITHER VIA GENOVA OR PISA. ASSISTANCE IN PLANNING TRAVEL WILL BE PROVIDED BY MONASH STAFF. AFTER COMPLETION OF THE FIELD-BASED COMPONENT OF THE UNIT, STUDENTS WILL BE FREE TO EXPLORE EUROPE ON THEIR OWN.</p>
ACCOMMODATION	<p>STUDENTS WILL BE ACCOMMODATED IN A HOSTEL IN THE VILLAGE OF MANAROLA, ABOUT 20 MINUTES WALK ALONG THE FAMED “VIA DELL’ AMORE” , A BEAUTIFUL COASTAL WALK CONNECTING THE VILLAGES OF MANAROLA AND RIOMAGGIORE. ALTERNATIVELY STUDENTS MAY TAKE THE 2 MINUTE TRAIN RIDE.</p>
COST	<p>THE TOTAL COST, INCLUDING ALL TRAVEL, FOOD AND ACCOMMODATION IS ESTIMATED AT ~\$3,000, MINUS ANY SUBSIDY PROVIDED BY MONASH ABROAD. IN THE PAST THESE CONTRIBUTIONS HAVE PROVEN TO BE VERY GENEROUS. WHATEVER THE FINAL COST, IT WILL BE A VERY INEXPENSIVE WAY TO GET TO EUROPE OVER THE AUSTRALIAN SUMMER WHILE AT THE SAME TIME UNDERTAKING EXCITING AND USEFUL STUDY.</p>
