### FACING HISTORY: REPRESENTING THE ARAB-ISRAELI CONFLICT

*Two sides of the story? Is there truth in history?*

This course will explore the world of narratives and images which tell the story of the Arab-Israeli conflict. The role of the media in the conflict will be scrutinised by analysing the theoretical background of reality construction, agenda setting and framing. Participants will study the variety of ways in which conflict is represented through news, documentaries, eyewitness accounts, archives, fiction, and film.

*'Facing History' is a two-week intensive course, taught by Dr Chanan Naveh of the International Relations Department, Hebrew University, Jerusalem. Dr Naveh is visiting Monash University as a Teaching Fellow of the Leon Liberman Chair in Modern Israel Studies.*
