Tessa Morris-Suzuki is Professor of Japanese History in the Research School of Pacific and Asian Studies, Australian National University, and currently President of the Asian Studies Association of Australia. Her research interests include issues of national identity, frontiers, minorities and citizenship in Japan; the representation of history in popular media; and globalization in the East Asian context. She has written and edited a number of books on Japanese history, among them *The Technological Transformation of Japan* (Cambridge University Press, 1994); *Re-inventing Japan: Time, Space, Nation* (M. E. Sharpe, 1998); *Henkyô kara nagameru* (A View from the Frontier) (Misuzu Shobô, 2000); and *Hihanteki sôzôryoku no tame ni: Gurôbaruka jidai no Nihon*, (In Search of Critical Imagination: Japan in an Age of Globalization) (Heibonsha, 2002)
